January 23, 2011

Moderator Larry Smith called the meeting to order following our regular church service.

Reverend Charlottie Havlicak led us in prayer.

Attendance Sheet: Membership tally was passed to ascertain who was present. Forty-four members signed.

Approval of 2010 Annual Meeting Minutes: Larry said he would like to defer the reading of the minutes from the January 24, 2010 Annual Membership Meeting. Kermit Peterson made the motion to accept the minutes as written. Linda Hallock seconded the motion. The vote was "Aye."

Presentation and Approval of Treasurer's Report: Bobbi Hoover stated that the \$63,000.00 item in the Budget under "Special Gifts" is needed to Balance the Budget and is taken from endowment earnings. Mark Robinson made the motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. Jayne Robinson seconded the motion. The vote was "aye."

Presentation and Approval of 2010 Annual Operating Reports: Mark Robinson, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, introduced the Trustees. John Hucks is in charge of the Church Insurance Policy and is general council for the Board. Linda Corder oversees the Music Program. David Siegle oversees the Church Stewardship program and keeps the Board current with Young Life activities. Ron Hines is the "guy" overseeing personnel. Paul DeSchryver is in charge of Buildings and Grounds. Paul has saved us thousands this year by all of his volunteer work. Treasurer Bobbi Hoover prepares all financial reports and pays the bills. The 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee, chaired by Lori DeSchryver, is very active. We are fortunate to have Lori. You can see our expenses are much more than our income. The Church's Endowments now total \$990,000.00, and are managed by Mark Daly at Wells Fargo Advisors. We are very fortunate to have endowments and our investments managed so well. Pastor Char says she is the most fortunate pastor in our conference and doesn't plan to retire for now. Linda Corder moved to accept the Annual reports. Kermit Peterson seconded the motion. The vote was "Aye."

Presentation of the 2011 Operating Budget: Our planned transfer is \$60,080.00 and will be under the Budget item "Transfer of Funds." We added Heartland Hunger to the budget at \$100.00 a month. Young Life is budgeted for \$100.00 a month but we give whatever is given for Young

Life by the congregation when it is more than \$100.00. Phil Reberger moved we approve the Budget as presented. Kathy George seconded. The vote was “Aye.”

January 22, 2012

The past year has seen continuing opportunities for our church to respond to the growing needs of outreach to the community. As you review the reports of the boards and committees, you will get a sense of the increased activities that have occurred to meet the challenges of these needs.

The growth of the music program's outreach can be noted in the greater stature of artists now available to be scheduled and the improved level of their program content. The Second Sunday Sounds @ Six presentations have become increasingly supported with attendance nearly doubling over the past year.

A.F.T.I.N. (Assistance For Those In Need) continues to provide an organized response of most of the churches in the community to needy transients in the area. While its mission is limited to those needing help to pass through our community, A.F.T.I.N.'s communication procedures being established have also provided the opportunity for the member churches to seek each other's assistance in dealing with the needs of their own established needs .

During this past year, the planning for the Centennial Celebration in 2012 has been completed and the celebration was launched in August of this year. Many exciting events and activities have been planned during this year of celebrating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the church that will culminate on August 12, 2012.

Since the Centennial Celebration involved most of the elected and appointed officers and members of boards and committees and their continuity is essential to the successful completion of the program, a meeting of the church council was held September 8, 2011. The following minutes reflect action taken to extend the terms of officers and others until December 31, 2012.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES  
SEPTEMBER 8, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 10:30 a.m. on September 8, 2011

A discussion was held concerning the need for continuity in the leadership of the church during the Centennial Year program. A motion was made by Mark Robinson and seconded by Pastor Char that the election and appointments normally made by the congregation at the annual meeting to fill the expiring terms would be suspended for the fiscal year 2011-2012 and unless otherwise desired by any incumbent, all terms would be continued through December 31, 2012. The motion was unanimously approved and all parties affected will be notified.

In the committee reports that follow, it is apparent that the goals that we have sought for our ministries continue to be substantially achieved.

The Board of Deacons serves the spiritual and social needs of the church and also serves in support of the pastor when the need arises. The board organizes activities supporting a broad cross-section of church needs. The Deacons who served in 2011 were: Kay Blas, Diane Green, C. J. Hines, Evelyn Kam, Marilyn Krahn, Jayne Robinson, Lori DeSchryver, Kathy Blackmon and Nancy Aamodt.

The “Deacon of the Month” prepares the Eucharist, makes sure our greeters and liturgists are signed up and oversees all deacon duties for that month. The Deacon Chair oversees recruitment of coffee hosts. The Deacons have organized a system of committees to extend the life of the church.

The Deacons organized many activities this year including the annual Winter Carnival “warming hut” in January. Kathy and Rob Blackmon provided fun for the children during the Easter service and also provided childcare for the 5 p.m. Christmas Eve service. In August, a combination church picnic and ice cream social was held at Pastor Char and Ray’s house with Jana Jae providing entertainment. Katherine Coonts provided the goodie bags for the Children’s Christmas Party in December and Frank and Kathy Eld played Father and Mother Christmas. Many meals and potlucks were organized by the deacons for special occasions throughout the year, including the church’s Annual Meeting, Lenten Meals, Vacation Bible School Hanging of the Greens and Church Choir meal between Christmas Eve services. A baby shower was organized as a special event for the family of Tyler Vance on June 26, in recognition of the coming birth of Kaitlin. A lot of hard work goes into the preparation, cooking and cleaning for these meals. We are blessed to have many members of our church who are always ready to pitch in and help.

Kathy Blackmon represented our church at a meeting in August to coordinate the Soup and Scripture luncheons for McCall-Donnelly High School students. Kathy coordinated church volunteers who helped prepare, serve and clean up for these lunches – three weeks in April, two weeks in September, and two weeks in December. Another youth activity we supported was the Harvest Party in October.

Jayne Robinson and Barbara Rhoades chaired the annual May Plant Sale to raise money for many of the deacon projects. Thanks to all the deacons and members of our church who volunteered for the project.

Kermit Peterson continues to get needed supplies for our kitchen, doing an excellent job of keeping the kitchen supplied with cups, plates, coffee, cream, etc. The Deacons keep the kitchen organized and clean. Kermit also makes and supplies fire starters, available to all, for use in starting our wood burning stoves and fireplaces during the cold months.

Diane Green kept the official minutes for the Board of Deacons. When Diane is unavailable for a meeting, the other deacons record the minutes. Diane makes sure that the minutes are typed and distributed. Diane visits the forest each Christmas to select, cut, and deliver a beautiful tree for the sanctuary.

Kathy Blackmon leads the weekly Women’s Bible Study, along with others who fill in from time to time. The women studied books of the Old Testament, including Joshua and Judges.

Marilyn Krahn and Evelyn Kam organized and provided flowers for special events. On a regular

basis, they kept our altar and our Fellowship Hall beautifully decorated.

The Prayer Chain, coordinated by C.J. Hines, has grown to 56 members. It continues to provide active support to members and friends in need of prayer.

Kay Blas and Jayne Robinson chaired the Food for Shut-Ins and Memorials Committee. Memorial luncheons were provided in honor of Gaylord Krahn and Betty May. Food was organized, prepared and served for these occasions and there were many people from our church family who helped with the serving and cleaning after these lunches. Meals were provided to some of our church family who were ill this year.

Jayne Robinson is our church representative to the Food Bank. Church members contributed time and food to the Food Bank during the months of March and October.

Visitation was shared by all the deacons with the guidance and help of Pastor Char. Visitation was made to several members of the church who had special needs due to illness or grief.

Linda Corder, with the help of Toni Corcoran, continued to coordinate Sharing Tree participation at Christmas time. We were blessed to share the joy of Christmas with one needy family with children. Additionally, we provided the gifts to 14 needy children through the Food Bank. Many members supported this activity through their generous giving.

Lori DeSchryver reports monthly on the activities supporting the Centennial Celebration for 2012. During the year she continued the sale of the Centennial Cookbook, Christmas cards, and note cards. She also organizes social activities as part of the Centennial Celebration.

Many deacons, along with other church members, pitched in to upgrade the landscaping. Several general cleanup days were supported by the Deacons and members. We extend a big thank you to all who helped with these projects.

The Deacons are selecting a “Founding Family” to honor each month of our Centennial celebration year. The Brown family honored in September, the Reberger family in October the Warden family in November, and the Boydston family in December.

Thanks to all of the 2011 Board of Deacons members for your dedication and hard work.

January 22, 2012

2011 was another challenging year for our church, due to the continuing poor economic conditions. Even so, we remain in a strong financial condition and a good positive and strong force in the community with all of our outreach programs.

I was again fortunate to have a very committed and hard-working group of Trustees for 2011. They included John Hucks, Ron Hines, Paul DeSchryver, Linda Corder, David Siegle, and Bobbi Hoover, who is also Treasurer. Nickie Them was our “Clerk, who took and distributed the minutes, and Larry Smith was again our Moderator.

Lori DeSchryver continued as chairman of our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, to be celebrated in August of this year. She proposed that we feature families who have been associated with the church as founders or major influences in our past. This has been started and we celebrated our fifth family this month.

As mentioned last year, we did some major repairs to our building during 2011. This included painting the building, roof repairs, repairs to handicap access ramp, some repairs or replacement of wood that was rotten, replacing the storage shed, and putting some siding on the bottom part of the building.

Our expenses continue to exceed our revenues and this is possible due to earnings from our endowments. Even so, the value of our endowments currently exceed the value when originally contributed to the church. This is the reason we are able to balance the budget and benefit the community with our outreach program.

Finally, as I stated last year, we are blessed to have Pastor Char. She is unselfish in putting church family above her own wants and concerns. She continues to be a large factor in the spiritual and cultural core of the McCall community. With her, our great facility and our most generous, caring congregation, we will continue to move forward in 2012.

Church Annual Report  
2011

**January**

Lori assisted me with painting the Heritage Hall and on into the Fellowship Hall. The urinal in men’s restroom was repaired and the toilet replaced, making it ADA compliant. In the process of repairing the urinal it was discovered that an old water pipe finally ruptured causing some flooding in the bathrooms. CTR responded for cleanup and repair work. During the painting, we encountered a power outage. I noted that only 2 emergency exit signs and lights activated. The others seemed to be broken. I asked David McQuade to look into the problem. David was very responsive and got them taken care of.

**February**

The painting of the fellowship hall was completed as well as repairs on the men’s room from the water damage. Painting was then completed through the hallway leading to the bathrooms. The toilet in the women’s restroom was replace with an ADA compliant toilet.

**March**

Window boxes were painted in fellowship hall. AME Electric was contacted to have them review our lighting issues and wiring problems. They submitted some bids on replacing the studio production lights in the sanctuary as well as problems we were having with the light switches for those lights. Unfortunately, their ideas were very involved as well as expensive. Dave McQuade decided he would take on some of the repair work to save the church some expenses.

#### **April**

This was a relatively slow month. Minor repair work continued as issues would arise. I started contacting contractors regarding the painting of the church. I wanted to get some bids submitted and get someone lined up and ready to go when the weather made it feasible to paint.

#### **May**

We had the annual cleanup the weekend of May 28th. Six paint contractors showed up to give estimates on painting. Of the six, only 3 submitted bids due to the condition of the church and amount of work necessary to guarantee their work.

#### **June**

Due to the poor condition of the exterior of the church, the trustees decided not to move forward with painting the church until we received advice from a licensed contractor on what to do about the repair work.

#### **July**

Mark Robinson gave a builder recommendation, Steve Minor. Steve advised the trustee's that the proper thing to do is to use metal wainscot siding on the lower half of the church to protect it from the weather. Next he took a look at the handicap ramp wall and found it to be almost completely rotted. We then discussed extending the roof line above the steps at the handicap ramp to protect the stairs from being further damaged. Afterwards we moved onto the storage shed and the thought of rebuilding it. Additionally, since the shed was going to be rebuilt, we suggested the roof be extended over the rear door of the church so as to keep it available in the winter as an emergency exit.

With all these ideas, Steve returned at the end of the month with a bid for the construction.

#### **August**

After reviewing the bid for construction, the trustees decided it was time to move forward on the repair work. The church is nearing its centennial celebration and the work is necessary for the church to survive for at least the next 100 years. Steve's crew got to work right away on tearing down the handicap ramp wall, installing the wainscot siding and rebuilding the storage shed. In the meantime we looked into having some sprinkler system repair work done to the front lawn area. Unfortunately, the work involved to fix or replace the sprinklers would have been too costly. So we settled for some minor sprinkler head replacement and adjustments.

Steve's crew was able to get the siding up on the church relatively fast and the handicap wall rebuilt, so it was on with the painting. We hired A&M painters to begin painting the outside of the church. This took several weeks to complete since the metal wainscot needed priming in order for the color to match the rest of the church.

#### **September**

By the middle of September, most all the painting was done. The storage shed took some time to complete as well as the roof extensions. Jim Gagliardi offered to help me tear out the planter that runs along the base of the handicap wall and replace it with decorative rock. We also tore out the plants by the side entrance of the church and put more decorative rock in there. Additionally we had some dirt brought in to repair the lawn of the church from equipment used to paint the church.

Inside the church, Dave McQuade began to plan out his attack on replacing studio production lights with less costly and more efficient lights. For some unknown reason, our sound system in the church went out. Dave investigated it but could not find the source of the problem. One day we both started to test it and noted smoke emitting from some of the controls. So Dave found a source in Boise to take it to for the repairs. At the end of the month, we got the main control panel back and got the sound system up and running again.

### **October**

Early in the month we scheduled a fall clean up in order to trim all the bushes so they would come in better the following year for our centennial. We removed all the debris that accumulated behind the church and hauled it to the dump. Late in the month we finally got the roof overhangs completed to where they could be painted. The painters came back and completed their job of painting the church. There was one issue of the roofing material be ordered but the wrong material being sent. This set up back until the middle of November. Dave McQuade began to build the boxes needed to install new lightning in the sanctuary of the church.

### **November**

As the first snows started to fall, we finally got the last bit of roofing repaired on the church. After all was said and done, we came in on target for the painting and came in \$10,000 under budget on the church repairs.

Tyler Vance found that the piano needed some repairs and adjustments to it. He contacted Paul Schiller to come up and make the repairs. Dave McQuade began the replacements of the studio lights in the sanctuary. He is to be commended for his ability to crawl in the attic and work in cramped spaces in order to get the big studio lights out and replace them with more efficient flood lights.

### **December**

We slowed down this month on repairs. After all the expenses over the entire year on repairs, it was time to take a break. Dave finished up on the lighting issues.

January 22, 2012

McCall Community Congregational Church continued to show that we are truly a community church, both here in our own community and in our conference. We opened the church to our community for Winter Carnival, a community youth choir, Second Sunday Sounds @ Six concerts, community Christmas concerts and many other concerts.

In our community, we continued to support Soup & Scripture by giving our time, money and lunches for the high school youth. We gave \$2,233.00 to Young Life, as it continues to be very active in our community. We provided scholarships for Pilgrim Cove Camp, making it possible for any child that wanted to attend camp, their chance. We provided cakes, cookies, candy and workers for McCall's Children's Halloween Party and filled Santa's bag with goodies for our own Children's Concert and worship at our church.

Our beautiful Christmas tree once again became a "Sharing Tree" and was filled with presents, as we helped several families to have a wonderful Christmas. People brought gifts and donated money so that we were able to fulfill many Christmas wishes.

We continued to support our conference. We collect \$555.15 for One Great Hour of Sharing and \$461.00 for Neighbors in Need. Our Christmas Eve offering was \$2,063.51 which was divided between Pilgrim Cove Camp, Veteran's of the Cross Fund and Our Church's Wider Mission.

This year our building fund brought in \$3,800.00. We also gave money to the food bank and were to help an additional family at Christmas time, which needed extra help. We collected money for the 2012 Anniversary Fund selling cookbooks, cards, singing Valentines and individual donations. We also continued to provide flowers for Easter and Christmas to add to the beauty of our church.

Church attendance remained about the same. We had 3,860 this year, which included 443 adults and children that attended our Christmas Eve services, as compared to 3,904 in 2010. Our two Christmas Eve services had more people than we have ever had, with 303 attending the first service and 140 attending the second.

We have once again accomplished many wonderful things this year. This is made possible with our church family giving an abundance of their time and money.

I know that I was called by God to come to McCall Community Congregational, United Church of Christ to serve as your pastor. That together as a church family we would work to restore the visions, dreams and goals of our founders.

I am always aware of God's calling upon my life. I promised God and the church family that I will always preach and teach the Word of God. I will preach simply...but before each message I pray for God's anointing on my message...I will never put my wants and concerns, above what the church family needs.....I will always follow where our Lord leads and guides.

I will love and care for everyone who comes through our doors....I believe in the power of prayer .....I will pray for our people...for my family...for my friends...for our community and for the world...God gave us the power of prayer and I will use that power daily.

As a church family ....we are into the celebration of our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary.....In 1912, a group of settlers, many who had come from New England....gathered together and shared their vision to start a church in this new, young community.

They invited the Superintendent of the Congregational church, who lived in New Meadows to come and charter this new fledgling congregation. About twenty-nine folks signed the original charter and in August of 1912, our Community Congregational Church was born.

Tom McCall and his brother donated the ground where the church now sits....but in 1912 there wasn't money to build both a church building and a school. So, the school was built first and for four years this new congregation worshiped in the schoolhouse.

When we reflect on the vision and dreams of those early church families, we must continue to focus on always setting dreams and goals into the future. We were given the gift of this beautiful historic and heritage building, and our gift to the future is to continue with the mission of this church. Our desire is to leave for the future congregations the same gifts that were left for us.

In 2011, we received into membership ten new resident members; Lee and Tami Rhodes, John and Judy Baker, Tom and Bev. Henderson, Janice Butner, Jack Cantu, Grace Turek and Marilyn Krahn changed her membership from associate member to resident member.

In 2011...death came to many beloved members and friends associated with our church family and community. Don Reynolds, Norman Aamodt, Betty May, Don Wills, Mary Margaret Robinson, Gaylord Krahn, William Eames, Beth Smock, Charles Turek, Ruth Bennett and China Towery. I officiated at eight of those funerals. Norm Aamodt's memorial service was held in Sunnyvale, California and Ruth Bennett's service was at St. Andrews Episcopal Church here in McCall and China Towery's funeral service was held at the Nampa United Church of Christ. Don Reynolds, Norman Aamodt and China Towery were members of this church.

I officiated at six baptisms and ten weddings, many of the weddings were held at Shore Lodge, Ponderosa Park and at lake side homes. Only one small wedding, a bride and a groom, was held here at the church.

The folks elected to serve on our boards and committees have served with faithfulness and dedication. In 2011, Larry Smith served as Church Moderator, Mark Robinson, is chairman of

the Trustees, and Jayne Robinson and C.J. Hines serve as co-chair of the Deacons. Jayne Robinson serves on the board of Heartland Hunger Resource Center, representing our church, and Kathy Blackmon has chaired our Soup and Scripture ministry. Our trustees and deacons are always busy with projects that serve you the church family. We serve Communion on the first Sunday of each month, with the assistance of the deacon of the month.

One of the greatest blessings of the wonderful church family is the service given by others.....Our Church Mice are many....Marilyn Krahn, flowers; David McQuade, lighting; Paul and Lori DeSchryver, all types of church up-keep. Then we have all the folks who help with our annual spring and fall yard clean-up. Jayne Robinson and Barbara Rhoades who chaired our plant sale held in May and all the people who come out to work and sell plants on this special day. Our members are always busy....and often the jobs they complete are not noticed...but the church could not run as smoothly without each and every one of you who serve. Marilyn Krahn and Evelyn Kam are responsible for the lovely flowers on the altar throughout the year, but especially our Christmas and Easter arrangements. CJ Hines has become our Scrap Book Historian ...and we have a wonderful seventeen year history of our church with pictures and articles.

Leslie Siegle served as our Financial Secretary, assisted by Nickie Them, Tony Nash and Lori De Schryver. Our treasurer, Bobbi Hoover has also served for many years, assisted by Cat Hall. These financial areas are huge responsibilities and we are so grateful for their faithful service. Our Women's Bible Study group, led by Kathy Blackmon continues to grow....this year we have been reading many of the books of the Old Testament.....and we try to have a social a few times each year. The ladies in the Bible study have been making prayer shawls for everyone who needs a special touch from our Lord and from knowing that others love and pray for them.

Our musicians are faithful and each one brings a special gift to this church. What a blessing to have Tyler Vance as our Music Director. Tyler plays piano, organ, guitar, as well as directing our choir and Jr. Choir, and helping to plan many of our special services, always being willing to accompany our soloists.

We have many great musicians and they serve in many capacities. They sing twice a month and for special services, Communion Sunday, Palm Sunday, Good Friday, Easter, Mother's Day, July 4<sup>th</sup> celebration, Gospel Sundays, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, Advent and the Christmas season, especially joyful was all the music for our two Christmas Eve Services.

Every Sunday for worship you are willing to serve as liturgists, ushers, greeters, coffee hosts, if a project needs to be completed, you are always willing to help. Your involvement in the mission of our church is a key to the great progress that we have made...You give faithfully to Our Churches Wider Mission. (OCWM); One Great Hour of Sharing; Neighbors In Need; Young Life; Pilgrim Cove Camp Scholarships; Veterans of the Cross; The Sharing Tree, Heartland Hunger Resource Center, Shepherd's Home and you continue to give generously to missions in our community and people in our church family.

Our Community Junior Choir, fully financed by this congregation, continues to meet each Monday after school, directed by Tyler Vance. The children performed for our Children's

There were around 100 people at our Fourth of July Patriotic Service...and our two Gospel Sundays.....At our Children's Christmas Program, we had twenty-six children in attendance, the Community Jr. Choir directed by Tyler Vance sang and also Dr. Bill Wharton had his young cello students perform. Gift bags were given to all the children, these are put together by Richard and Catherine Coonts and always Father and Mrs. Christmas, (Frank and Kathy Eld) visit the children. Our Christmas Eve Services were especially beautiful...and the warmth and beauty of the sanctuary was very inviting....we had 443 people attend our two Christmas Eve services. The choir sang and we had special solos by Tom Henderson, Adam Duncan and Dylan Vance, Ray Havlicak, Linda Corder, Helen Moore and Lois Fry. Pastor Char presented the Christmas Eve Homily, "If That Isn't Love."

I have spent many hours making home visits and hospital calls. This is a joy for me, getting to know each one of you on a more personal level.

I serve as a Volunteer Chaplain at St. Luke's McCall Hospital and I make monthly visits at the hospital and I also attend a monthly class presented by educators at the Hospital, and I now serve on the Community Medical Fund, representing the community of McCall and surrounding towns. I am a member of Rotary, where I serve as chaplain and also a member of Progressive Club.

The Idaho Association Meeting was held this year at Challis, Idaho, on the weekend of September 23, 24<sup>th</sup>.....Our meetings were held at the Living Waters Ranch. Delegates from our church were Pastor Char and Ray; Earl Dodds and Linda Corder, Kermit Peterson and Janice Butner and Jim and Rhonda Gagliardi. Moderator, Jack Wenske from Boise Wright Congregational, UCC, served as Moderator and Linda Corder from McCall, UCC served as Scribe.

Ray and I continue to enjoy our home...Every time I walk in the door I thank God for you and for the blessing of our home. We are excited that we can look ahead with great hope and trust in God to the days and year ahead. If you have an idea for our Dreams, Goals and Visions List, talk to any of the trustees, the moderator, the deacons or to Pastor Char. We are able to move forward with our plans and dreams because everyone volunteers with such love and care for this building...and the ministries that go out from here.

We are so excited to be in the midst of 100 year celebration. Lori DeSchryver is the chairman of our Centennial Celebration and this year she has accomplished many projects. We began our year of celebration with an All Church Picnic held at our home. It was a great success and a large crowd gathered for hamburgers, hot dogs, salads and dessert. Jana Jay and her family stopped by and played and sang a few numbers for the picnic guests.

In October we began to honor many of our families who have made a difference in this

church and community. We have honored the Brown Family, the Reberger family, Harry and Lois Warden, Johnny and Virginia Boydston and this month the Wallace Family. We will continue this tradition by honoring Meryl Kantola, Jack and Jeanette Seetin, Martha Chitwood, Ann Edwards, Ellen Ikola, Phyd Huffman and Clint and Nova Warren.

The final celebration will be the week-end of August 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>, 2012 with a banquet at Hunt Lodge and on Sunday morning at worship we will have a most joyful celebration.

The real strength of this church is each one of you, our church family. You are filled with love and commitment and you share a warm, wonderful fellowship with everyone who comes through our doors.
